

This training program explores the role of Early Childhood Educators in the identification and support of children at risk of harm

Learners will understand how to support the protection of children in many situations, be able to recognise and identify the indicators of child abuse, and how to effectively report and manage this information.

As a Learner you will develop skills and knowledge around:

- Indicators of abuse and the impacts of children at risk of harm;
- · Maintaining confidentiality and using appropriate reporting channels;
- Employing child-focused work practices, incorporating the United Nations Rights of the Child;
- Trauma-informed care;
- Ethical considerations.

On successful completion of this program, students will receive a Statement of Attainment for CHCPRT025 Identify and report children and young people at risk.
