This includes engaging in learning and play, development of language and social skills, nurturing agency and wellbeing, and responding to health and safety issues for vulnerable young people.

By successfully completing CHC30121 Certificate III in Early Childhood Education and Care as a School Based Trainee (SBAT), not only will you have up to two years of work experience, you will also be a qualified Early Childhood Educator and have accumulated 8 units of credit towards your HSC. From there you could further your studies and become a Diploma-qualified Educator, offering an alternative pathway to a University Degree.

- ✓ Complete 100 days of paid work (one day a week) in a registered early childhood service starting Term 4, Year 10.
- ✓ Complete online training in CHC30121 Certificate III in Early Childhood Education and Care.

- ✓ Gain credit towards the HSC - 4 units in Year 11 and 4 units in Year 12. This is a non-ATAR course.
- ✓ On successful completion, receive a nationally recognised qualification in CHC30121 Certificate III in Early Childhood Education and Care and a Certificate of Proficiency.
